As always, regular, frequent reception of Communion is encouraged, to strengthen us in virtue and the struggle against the flesh, and to unite ourselves to Christ and His Church. Those receiving weekly should also aim to confess regularly, every 1-3 months or so.

Tone 2 Troparion (*Forefathers*)

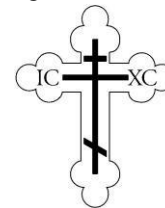
Through faith Thou didst justify the Forefathers,
